**Senator (1918), Senator of the Civil Cassation Department of the Senate (1919–1938),
Acting Chair of the Civil Cassation Department (1933–1934)**

Education: *University of Tartu, Faculty of Law; Doctoral degree obtained at the University of Göttingen, Germany.*

Before the Senate: *Trainee in the judicial system and secretary at the Ryazan Regional Court; Assistant of Advocate; Sworn Advocate in Riga; Lecturer at Riga Polytechnic Institute.*

After the Senate: *In 1939 he left for Germany.*

Additional information: *First Temporary Dean of the Faculty of Economics and Law, University of Latvia, Professor of Commercial Law, Legal Adviser. Adviser to the Latvian-German Settlement Commission; One of the developers of the 1937 Civil Law. He has worked in the unification of cheques and bill of exchange rights in the Baltic States.*
